UFAW invites nominations for two prestigious awards

The Universities Federation for Animal Welfare (UFAW) is now inviting nominations for two of its prestigious awards to be made in 2013.

The UFAW Medal for Outstanding Contributions to Animal Welfare Science recognises the exceptional achievements of an individual scientist who has made a major contribution to the advancement of animal welfare. It is open to individuals whose research, teaching, service and advocacy has significantly benefited the welfare of animals. Nominated candidates may be based anywhere in the world. The winner of the award will receive a cheque for £3,000, a commemorative medal and framed award certificate. There were two Medal winners in 2012: Professor Christine Nicol of the University of Bristol, and Professor Marian Stamp Dawkins of Oxford University.

The UFAW Young Animal Welfare Scientist of the Year award recognises the achievements of a young scientist who has made significant contributions to improving the welfare of animals. It is open to students, anywhere in the world, currently studying for a doctoral degree and to post doctoral scientists who are within six years of completing their PhD work. The winner of this award will receive a cheque for £1,000 and a framed award certificate. The winner of the 2012 Young Animal Welfare Scientist award was Dr Charlotte Burn, Lecturer in Animal Welfare at the Royal veterinary College.
